
Canada: The Open Data Report

The People






Canada has the 38th largest population but the 10th largest economy in the world with **35.2 million** Canadians living far and wide, coast-to-coast, as of 2016.

Almost **5%** of Canadians identified as Indigenous in the 2016 Census. That's **1.7 million** people!


Canada is a multicultural place. We're home to 254 different ethnicities.


The Land





Maple syrup is a Canadian staple. In 2016, there were a total of
